Categorisation

This has been yet another outstanding year in the life of St Alban's. We were delighted in February when the Welsh Government published its categorisation of schools. St Alban's is rated as a GREEN school, the top category, but not only that, St Alban's is ranked as 4th highest in Wales. This categorisation is the result of the excellent work of the staff and the students over the previous three years.

A brief summary of the Categorisation Judgement is set out below:

The overall categorisation is: GREEN

because:

- The school's leadership and governors clearly know its strengths and areas for development;
- The governing body has a good understanding of the school's performance and operates effectively as a critical friend;
- Leadership capacity in the school is developed through the Outstanding Teacher Programme;
- The school has demonstrated improvements against the recommendations from the last inspection and from the book scrutiny carried out in summer 2014;
- Performance indicators over time demonstrate an improving trend and are consistently above LA, national and family averages;
- Self-evaluation processes draw on a wide range of direct evidence so that leaders identify the strengths and areas for improvement in teaching and learning;
- There is a highly effective line management process in operation that quality assures leadership and management and the work of teachers across all areas of the school;
- The school has developed robust and highly effective policies and processes to monitor, evaluate and improve standards of teaching;
- Most teaching at the school is at least good or better;
- The school has effective staff performance management systems to identify and meet staff's training needs and reflect whole school improvement issues; and
- School leaders regularly look outside the school in developing best practice.



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Curriculum (including main changes 2014-2015)

- St Alban's curriculum is broad, balanced and differentiated. It covers all statutory requirements, including the delivery of Religious Education and Welsh as core subjects, and the statutory National Literacy and Numeracy Framework. All learners needs are met, and as a result most students achieve good outcomes on courses tailored to meet their needs. In addition, behaviour is good in lessons because students are appropriately challenged and engaged.
- There is a comprehensive range of extra-curricular activities including 40 students participating in the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award Scheme.
- We have a variety of after school clubs including, baking, choirs, and a range of sports.

Provision for Toilet facilities

The School has gender segregated toilet facilities and disabled access facilities for pupils, staff and visitors. All toilets are maintained to a high standard with a housekeeper on site during the day. Toilets are also monitored by staff during and after the school day.

Catholic Life of the School

The school's Catholic ethos is central to the life of the school and all students experience a genuine Catholic education with Christ at the Centre. A highlight of the year was the school's mission "Animate" from the Liverpool Archdiocesan Youth Ministry Team in the Autumn Term 2014. The theme of the week was "Fuel into flame the gifts of God". In addition there is an annual in-service day for all teaching and support staff on the Catholic ethos of the school. There are retreats for students and regular Mass and liturgical services. The student Chaplaincy team plays an important role in ensuring that the Catholic ethos is developed throughout the school.

The Senior Leadership Team

At the end of 2015 with the retirement of Mrs Collier, the Senior Leadership Team has been restructured. Alongside Mr Coady, the Headteacher, Mr Foster is now the sole Deputy Headteacher. There are three Assistant Headteachers, Ms Julie Gloss, Mrs Elizabeth Davies and Mr Kevin Jones.


